


# UNKNOWN FREEDOM FIGHTERS

There are so many freedom fighters of India who contributed to the Independence movement but their name faded into darkness, There were so many freedom fighters who booked into the eye of the tyrannical British rules are dared to raise slogans of an Independent India. Some are celebrated all across the world among the Indian community while there is, remaining anonymous of the masses today. These bodies are truly for India's freedom fighters as well as well as who fought equally but had never got any share of recognition but as citizens of this country, we should acknowledge the unsung heroes.

## SENAPATI BAPAT

Pandurang Mahadev Bapat, popularly known as senapati Bapat, was a figure in the Indian Independence movement. He acquired the title of senapati, meaning commander, as a consequence of his leadership during the Mulshi Satyagraha. Armed with a 'bomb manual' and two revolvers, Bapat returned to India in 1908. He disseminated the knowledge of bomb - making amongst the Indian revolutionaries. Bapat wanted to build a country of wide network before starting the struggle against the British.

BORN : 12 November 1880 | DIED: 28 November 1967

## TARA RANI SHRIVASTAVA

Tara Rani Shrivastava was an Indian freedom fighter and a part of Mahatma Gandhi's Quit India Movement on 12<sup>th</sup> August 1942, called upon by Mahatma Gandhi,


she and her husband organised a March to rise the flag of India in front of the Siwan police station, an act that could be seen as " a major defence ". The police, in preventing them from hoisting the flag, lathi charged the protestors. Phulendu Babu her husband was among the shot and wounded. Tara Rani continued her March to the police station. She continued to be part of the freedom struggle until the partition of India on 15<sup>th</sup> August 1947.

## KANAIYALAL MANEKLAL MUNSHI

Popularly known as Ghanshyam Vyas, was an independence movement activist, politician, writer and educationist from Gujarat state. A lawyer by profession, he later turned to author and politician. He participated in the ' Civil Disobedience Movement ' in 1930 and 1932 and was arrested and spent two years in jail in 1932. Munshi was elected in the 1937 in Bombay presidency election and as Home Minister, he suppressed the communal riots in Bombay. He was elected to the Bombay Legislative Assembly.

**CONCLUSION:** It is intended as an indication only, not an exhaustive list, but nearly to highlight the names that have been lost, our appreciation and renaissance should be extended to those who sacrificed without privilege of being attributed names or dates. Being able to identify our true, unknown fighters is beneficial for us as a nation, & they deserve our respect & adulation, instead of the purported reality.

# NATION'S PRIDE

**“WHERE TIGERS THRIVE, IT IS A SIGN THAT THE ECOSYSTEM IS HEALTHY”**

International Tiger's Day is observed on 29<sup>th</sup> July to raise awareness about the declining tiger population in the world. This day encourages the work of conservation of tigers. The decline happened in the 20<sup>th</sup> century and the number is luckily rising again due to the continued efforts of the people. India prepares the tiger estimation report every 4 years to keep track of them.

In 1973, Project Tiger was started in India which was a unique plan to save tigers. 9 tiger reserves were formed since then. Tiger habitats include forests that capture carbon dioxide from the air and help fight climate change.

Global Tiger Day celebrated on 29<sup>th</sup> July, which is also called International Tiger Day. The world and India can celebrate the recovery of at least one endangered species. India is now reporting increased tiger numbers. And a recent IUCN (International Union for Conservation of Nature Assessment)



suggests that tiger numbers have increased by 40% since 2005. This is a cause of celebration, but is the rise in tiger numbers enough to prevent their extinction?

International Tiger Day was introduced in 2010 after it was discovered that 97% of the tigers had disappeared in the past century, with only 3000 remaining. A number of countries around the world signed an agreement at St. Petersburg tiger summit in Russia to prevent the situation from worsening. This year, Tiger's Day 2022 aims at protecting and expanding tiger habitats apart from preserving them. This day is observed by many organizations such as WWF FOR nature, IFAW etc.

## ALL INDIA TIGER ESTIMATION REPORT

According to the released reports, India has achieved 'to' 2022 target of tiger population within the country. We now have 2967 tigers. The growth in the 4th cycle of the tiger census has been 33%. Madhya Pradesh saw the highest numbers of tigers that is 526 followed by Karnataka and Uttarkhand.

Tigers have long been people and planet protectors. This is our chance to return the favour. Let's let our youth lead the way.






